<b>wear</b>	<b>wore</b>	<b>worn</b>	porter (habits)

### Prétérit en « EW » = participe passé en « AWN » ou en « OWN »

<b>fly</b>	<b>flew</b>	<b>flown</b>	voler
<b>grow</b>	<b>grew</b>	<b>grown</b>	grandir
<b>know</b>	<b>knew</b>	<b>known</b>	savoir
<b>throw</b>	<b>threw</b>	<b>thrown</b>	jeter
